Why you want to fill the nominated position: I would like to establish continuity between this year and last year. Under my leadership, the Programming Committee was successful in creating a template that we used to plan each monthly meeting. We successfully secured speakers and venues for each month, planned and executed corporate tours to Haliburton and Emerson Electric facilities. We also successfully planned a Leadership Workshop (April 2015) which will not only help the Dallas Chapter solidify a Strategic Plan for 2015-2016, the Ft. Worth and collegiate chapters will benefit as well.

The Dallas Section has done an excellent job of establishing a K-12 program, however, research shows that even though women represent 50% of the population, we only represent 15% of engineers in the U.S. in addition women are twice as likely as men to leave the profession within the first 10 years of their careers. So in my mind, Professional Development for our working members is just as important as a strong K-12 program.

If elected I will work on a Strategic Plan for Professional Development – I was able to secure a template from Region I which will provide the Dallas Section with a starting point. The Plan will include monthly meetings at Corporations, Joint Diversity Activities with SHPE and NSBE and a focused professional development plan for our members so that we can become leaders within our respective corporations and academic institutions.
