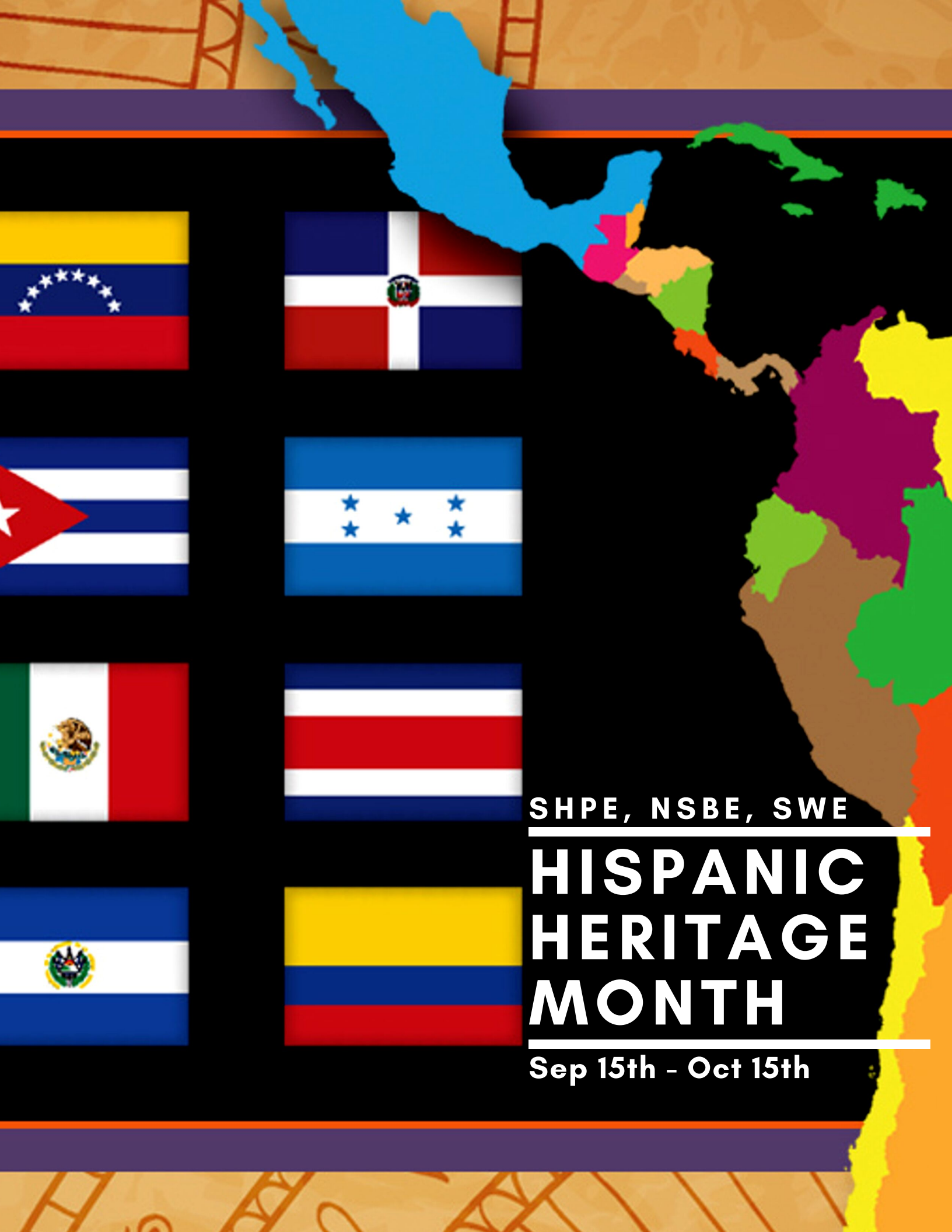




SHPE, NSBE, SWE
